October's Bridge Teaser:

What is a Yarborough, where did the term come from, and what are the odds of being dealt one?

Answer: A Yarborough is a bridge hand which contains no card higher than a nine. The odds are 1827:1. The second Earl of Yarborough is reported to have bet at odds of 1000:1 that a bridge hand of 13 cards would contain at least one card that is a ten or higher. The earl made a lot of money at the bridge table!
